EXAMINATION RESULTS

We are pleased to be able to report success in the public examinations. At A Level there was a 98.3% pass rate with 62.7% of the grades at A*-C.

Most of our leavers have been accepted on courses of their choice either at university or college. This year's top performers were Daniel Archer and Shamin Patel who took up their places at Bath University (Politics and International Relations) and Birmingham University (Law). We wish them well and, indeed all the others who will take up their places this month.

The performance by our GCSE candidates was very much in line



with expectations. Overall, the pass rate at A*-C was 88.28% a rise for the third consecutive year, and the percentage of pupils gaining 5 or more A*-C grades was 93.3%. Put another way this represents 8.88 passes per candidate. Congratulations to all those individuals who now have the opportunity to test their resolve at the next level. The strongest performers in this entry were Sasha Versovic (9A*s, 3As) and Hyunjae Lee (6A*s, 4As, 1B and 1C).

ARRIVAL / DEPARTURE AT SCHOOL



Senior School pupils should be dropped off and picked up in

Ewell Village car parks, on the A24 by-pass slip road or on London Road and walk up to the School.

Any cars which have to come into Church Street should adhere to the voluntary 'one-way' system:

Drive up Church Street from 'Il Laghetto' and down by the side of the Church towards London Road. Holman Court is a private residence and should not be entered.

Please do not park carelessly in Church Street or Glyn Close as this will inconvenience the residents and cause safety hazards for the pupils.
